TRAILS Spotlight

A sand and water table is a great addition to any early childhood classroom. Children learn many new skills by exploring with sand and water. They practice math skills by pouring the sand and water into different size containers. They learn cause and effect when they discover the way that sand changes when it becomes wet. They are learning science when they discover that some items will sink to the bottom when placed in the water and some items will float to the top. They practice fine motor skills by pouring, scooping, and sifting. They learn to share by playing with others.

Begin with a few simple props for the children to explore with and then add more to keep their interest. Props can include buckets and shovels, funnels, measuring cups, squirt bottles, sponges, and any other materials that can be used with sand and water. TRAILS has sand and water tables and a variety of sand and water toys that are available for providers to borrow.

Sock Hop

Until we figure out where missing socks actually go when they vanish from our laundry baskets, here's a way to get some use from the one's left behind while having fun making a cute Easter decoration with the little ones!

Materials:

- Spoon or funnel
- Child's sock
- Ribbon
- Felt
- White pom-pom or cotton ball
- Dried lentils
- Rubber band
- Scissors
- Tacky Glue

Instructions:

1. To make your own bunny bean bag, use a spoon or funnel to add dried lentils to a child's sock, filling it up just past the heel. Close the sock with a tightly looped rubber band.
2. To create the head and neck, tie a ribbon around the sock just below the heel.
3. Use scissors to cut the sock's cuff into two ears, rounding the edges to give them the right shape.
4. Cut a nose, teeth, and eyes from felt. Attach the facial features and a white pom-pom or cotton ball tail with tacky glue.

What do you see?

OK, let's be honest here. Nearly every year we have a child in our care that gets under our skin. We love them, but they challenge us. Perhaps they demand attention at the most inconvenient times. Maybe their temperament is in exact opposition to ours. It might be the fact that their home culture collides with our beliefs. Whatever the reason, we find ourselves sighing, rolling our eyes, or using sharp tones when we respond to that child.

I ask you to *honestly* answer the following question, 'Where do you see that child in 20 years, who although is as cute as a button, for one reason or another gets under your skin?'

If you said anything other than "healthy, happy, and personally successful" then we need to take a closer look at the situation that this child finds themselves in.

Let us begin with the fact that caregiving is a very personal and powerful profession. We have the ability to touch a life in the most profound and long-lasting ways. We are helping to raise a child, to pour into their messages that they will refer to again and again—"you are loved", "you are worthy", "you are capable", "you are a joy to be around". Sadly, we can also unintentionally and subtly, send the opposite messages. Regardless of the messages we send through the myriad of ways we send them, children tend to believe us.

So I challenge you to take a moment and to again ask yourself a question, 'What will a child be like in 20 years as a result of being in my care?' Write it down. Post it. Refer to it daily. Then take a moment and think, are my actions in line with that vision? If not, you have the power to change and grow. The life in your care deserves it.

Through an articulation agreement with Pierpont Community and Technical College, participants who complete the West Virginia Infant/Toddler Professional Development Program for Caregivers may be eligible for 3 hours of college credit.
